Melpar's annual drive to increase the number of subscribers to the Payroll Savings Plan to buy U. S. SAVINGS BONDS opens Tuesday, February 20th.

In a detailed report, Melpar's President J. P. Chambers displayed charts showing that the Division met it's 1972 bookings goal and enters 1973 with a better backlog than originally anticipated.

During 1972 plant overhead and general and administrative expenses dropped dramatically. Mr. Chambers credited full cooperation by supervisors and managers for the excellent record.

In a summary of E-Systems Corporate performance for 1972, Mr. Dixon described also the outstanding performance at Garland Division and continuing improvements in several other divisions.
