E-Teamers and their families vied for prizes while showcasing their musical and culinary prowess. Talent coordinator Loretta Price reported that singer-guitarist

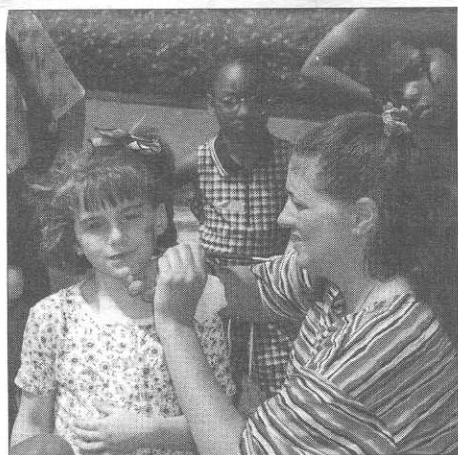


Ed Melendez (*far right*) wages battle at the dunking booth.

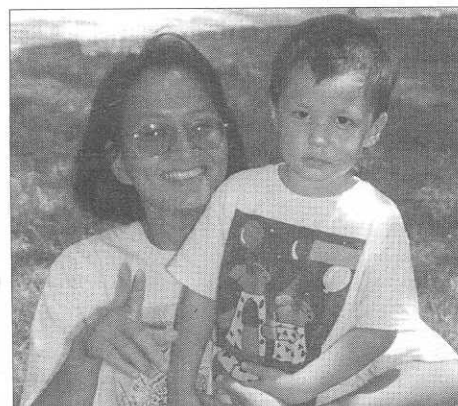
Bryce Hervias, 12-year-old son of Victor Hervias, won the \$50 talent competition prize.

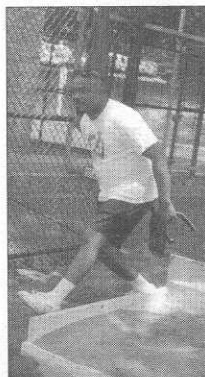

Chairman and CEO Dennis J. Picard highlighted the company's recent accomplishments, including Raytheon's continued growth as a diversified commercial company, the contribution of Raytheon E-Systems and the company's strong financial performance.

Following a review of Raytheon's major businesses, the Chairman reaffirmed the company's key strategic goals:

- Expand Raytheon as a diversified commercial company
- Remain top-tier in defense
- Apply defense technologies in commercial markets
- Continue global growth
- Remain a strong financial performer
- Make quality a top priority
- Enhance shareholder value while remaining competitive to provide the most jobs for the people of Raytheon

In a question-and-answer session following the presentation, Mr. Picard laid out his vision for Raytheon as a \$20 billion company by the year 2000. □

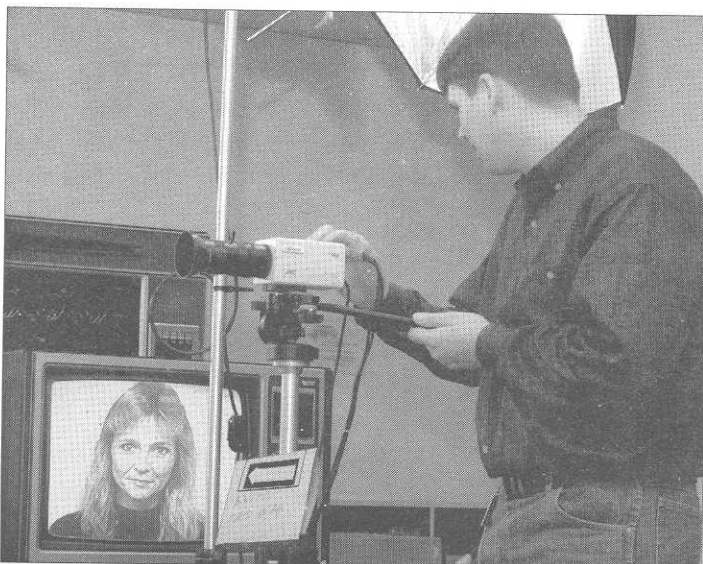

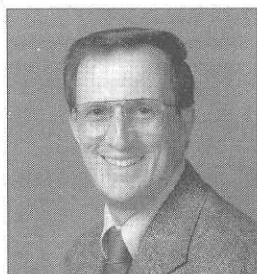
Rebadging Underway

Computer-Aided Products: Over 600,000 active and discontinued integrated circuit part numbers and vendor data sheets.

Worldwide Standards Index: DoD-adopted and foreign industry standards, including IPC and British Defence Standard.

Wilson Disc: Indexes and abstracts of journal articles, featuring full Boolean search capability.

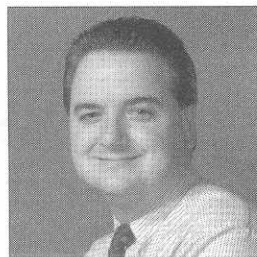
Reference Collection: Current relevant reference works, expanded as required to support Division technological trends and directions.

Spring Training Update

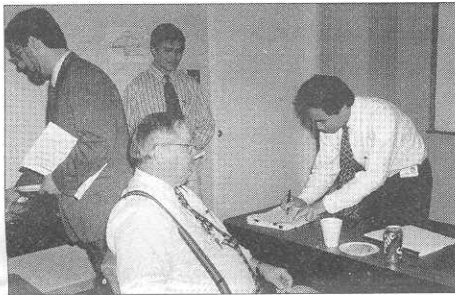

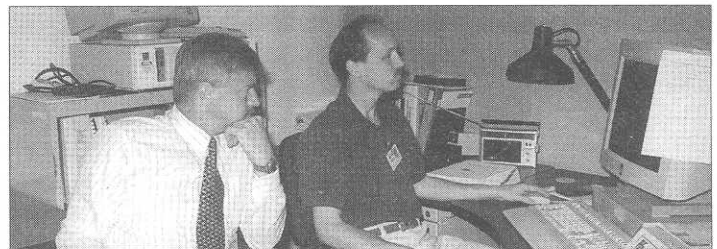

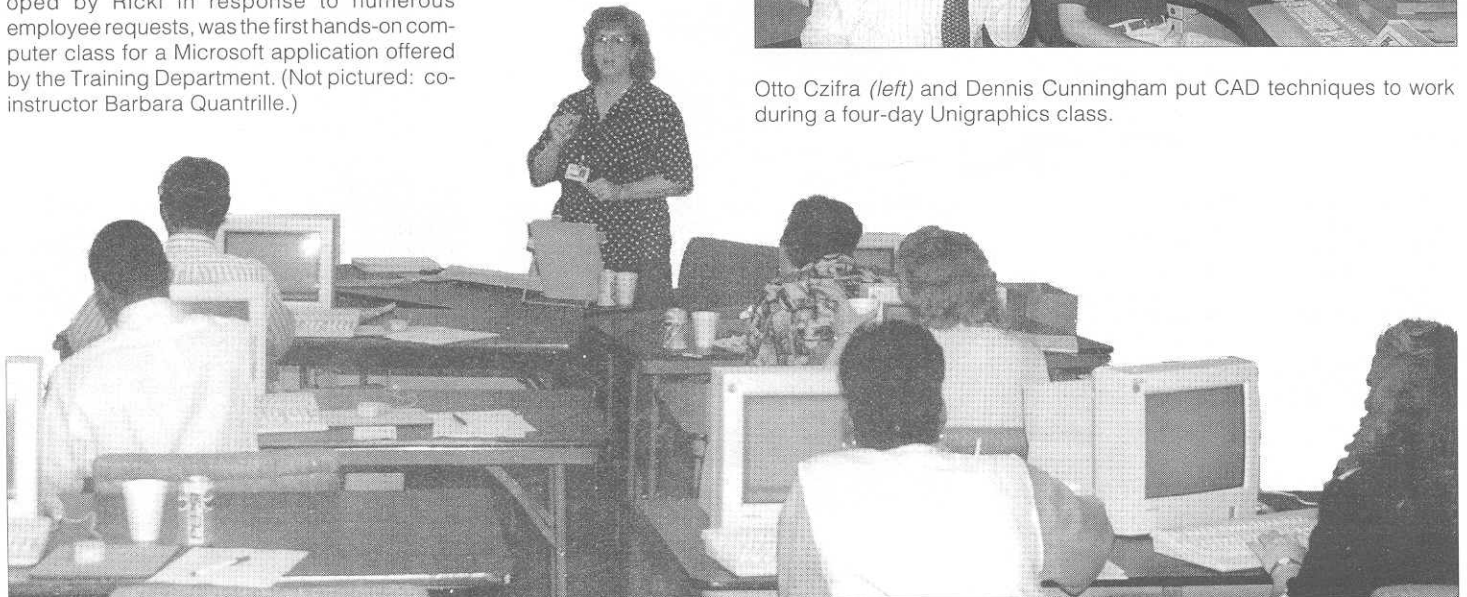
